

There are exceptions to the clock rules below that have purposefully been omitted in order to simplify the learning process. Below are the basics that a new official should understand.

# To Begin the Game

The clock starts for the first time when R touches a free kick.

### The clock shall start on the ready for play whistle:

	Sub-Varsity	Varsity
When B or R is awarded a new series	Yes	No
After penalty enforcement	Yes	Yes
After an official's time-out	Yes	Yes
At the beginning of a period	Yes	No
After an inadvertent whistle	Yes	Yes

(NOTE: "No" denotes that the clock shall start on the snap.)

# The clock shall start with the snap:

	Sub-Varsity	Varsity
When the ball goes out of bounds	Yes	Yes
When B or R is awarded a new series	No	Yes
After an incomplete forward pass	Yes	Yes
After a charged time-out	Yes	Yes
At the beginning of a period	No	Yes
When a team attempts to consume time illegally	Yes	Yes
When the penalty for delay of game is accepted	Yes	Yes

(NOTE: "No" denotes that the clock shall start on the ready for play.)

#### The clock shall be stopped when:

- 1. The down ends following a foul
- 2. An official's time-out is taken
- 3. A charged time-out is granted
- 4. The period ends
- 5. The ball is out of bounds
- 6. Any forward pass is incomplete
- 7. A score or touchback occurs
- 8. A fair catch is made

#### If the clock is stopped, it will start on the ready-for-play signal if it was stopped:

- 9. By an official's time-out
- 10. Because a foul occurred
- 11. Because of an inadvertent whistle
- 12. An inadvertent whistle is sounded
